





Park Point Community Club Meeting Minutes 6/19/2008

A quorum of members present. Last month's minutes approved.

Financial Report

Chuck Flaig presented detailed information on inflow and out going payments – current balance reported as \$52,764.33. Many art fair transactions this time of year.

Art Fair Update

The posters are up, nice design by Tom Rauschenfels. Carla is working on a program with a map of the fair and has sold advertisements. This brochure will be passed out at the entrance to the fair. Discussion about the qualifications of the security guard needed at the Saturday dinner that will include alcohol. Volunteers needed for set-up, greeting, passing out programs, clean up, etc.

Youth Program

Joy Fouts is leading the program again this year. Attendance is good. Some new kids this year. Older kids are helping out with little kids. Discussion regarding confusion of youth program open on Fridays. Dennis Hoelscher cleared this up with Kathy Bergen. The community club has funded the program to be open from 10-2 on Fridays. There is a rodent problem. Joy contacted the city who hired an exterminator to set a trap line for mice. Discussion about purchasing some mouse proof bins for supplies for the youth program and installing a threshold to reduce the gap under the door.

Environmental Committee

Dave Johnson reported that the plantings are doing well. Thank you to all of the volunteers who planted this year and in previous years. Silver poplars from Cloquet at the S-curve are thriving.

Erosion efforts are successful, no sand piling up in the parking lot of the S-curve. Discussion about porta-potty placement, trash barrels, city mowing crews, lack of vandalism of the boardwalk. Still working on reimbursement for the S-curve project from the county. Watch for the new sign, it's in the works.

Airport Committee report from Dave Poulin. Government agencies still working on what environmental assessments will be needed. Discussion about current airport location, moving runway out towards the bay or out to western Duluth where the power lines might be a problem.

New Business

Executive Board Report

Dave Poulin reported that the executive board met Monday night and discussed creating a committee to review the by-laws and eliminate or change the committees. We will discuss this at next month's meeting.

Question asked about the Gates Memorial Garden next to Lafayette parking lot. The bench is gone. The Sedgwicks are working hard on this Garden Club project. Discussion about the work of the Garden Club over the years. Many lilacs, azaleas, trees are doing well up and down the Point. Thank you for all of the donated plants and the hard work.

Discussion of members regarding rumors about the possible future sale of Lafayette and the property for residential development. Motion to create a letter directed to Sharla Gardner, Don Ness, city attorney and other city councilors from the PPCC leadership stating our feelings about preserving our community center here at Lafayette. Motion carried.

Report from Firefighter Chad Rindal. Calls are on the rise, mostly medical calls. 76 to date this year compared to 51 for same time period last year. Have seen a trend of an increasing number of calls over the past few years. Discussion about the cost of medical calls and possible future billing of insurance companies, charging for false alarms, etc. Chad reminded residents to check the batteries in smoke detectors. Smoke won't wake you up but it will kill you.

Meeting ended shortly after 8pm. Next meeting at Dave Lavamaki's residence as Lafayette is rented on our usual meeting date.*


