Fire Hall #5 Needs A New Home



It doesn't take too close an inspection to see that Fire Hall #5 on Park Point needs major work. It's been on the top of the list for replacement for a couple years. Various plans have been proposed and then withdrawn – everything from relocating it to a new building at Lafayette Square to a bigger “pull through” building on it's current site, with a widening of 22nd Street and adding a turn around circle. Finally a more modest plan was approved, saving part of the old building, but changing the configuration and building a new addition. Construction is scheduled to begin in July and (we hope) finish up in February.

However, that presents another problem. During construction, both the fire truck and firefighters will need to find a temporary home on Park Point. They are our first responders. We need them here.

The Coast Guard has offered one of their bays as a temporary quarters, but only until ice-up. Then they'll need to put a boat in there. A hangar at the airport was suggested, but that would put the fire truck down at the far end of the Point.

As of this writing, I don't think a location has been found. So if you've got any good ideas, give Fire Hall #5 a call. 723-3215

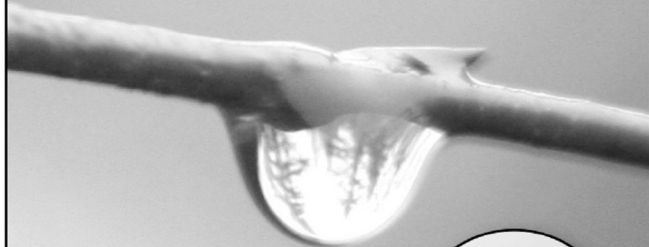

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Park Point Community Club Meeting Minutes

April 15, 2010

Meeting called to order by President Dave Poulin at 7:07 pm, all officers present.

Approximately 23 residents in attendance.

Motion made to accept minutes from March meeting as printed in the Breeze. Accepted with 2 corrections from Dave Poulin. 1-Scott Wolff and Kinnan Stauber contributed to the letter written by LeAnn Rutherford to Representative Jim Oberstar re. tree trimming at Sky Harbor Airport. 2- Re. shed donation. Shed donation did not work out at this time. Potential donor is out of town until May.

Motion to allow the Duluth Boat Club to use Lafayette facilities free of charge for an upcoming event. Wolfe/Robins. Motion carried.

Thanks to Dennis Hoelscher for his work on the scheduled lifts for the Aerial Bridge.

Youth Committee-

Motion made to spend up to \$5000.00 on the summer youth program. (This was the second vote on this expenditure.) Dartanyan/L. Mackay. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report-Chuck Flaig presented report. Current balance = \$42,914.05

Environmental Committee-Kinnan Stauber presented report on tree planting projects. Call Dick Gould for time and place of Saturday planting events in May. Kinnan presented details of the 1939 conveyance of property on Park Point for recreational use. Questions were raised about the legitimacy of the sale of property past 43rd for development in 2008. The Park boundaries must be acknowledged to protect land from future development. Call Kinnan for more details. Dick Gould gave a report on the decaying sewer and water infrastructure on Park Point.

Firefighter Chad Rindal- 10 runs during the last 30 days -5 medical and 5 miscellaneous calls. Several residents took advantage of the smoke detector program. Call 723-3215 for details of that program. Housing is needed for fire truck and firefighter during construction of new fire hall. Construction scheduled to begin in July 2010 and wrap up February 2011. Please call Chad if you have a heated garage for rig and a place for a firefighter to stay during those months. Thank you to the firefighters who cleared off the boardwalk at the S curve.

Motion to spend up to \$500.00 to extend the walkway over to the porta-potty at the S curve site. Hoelscher/T. Mackay. Motion carried.

Art Fair report-Carla Tamburro presented report. 118 artists have been selected via jury. 10 are on the waiting list. Food vendors have been selected and are being notified.

Discussion about collaboration with the "Friends of the Parks" group.

Flagpole report-Tom Mackay thanked those who helped with this project at the S curve and donated flags.

Motion was made to reimburse Tom Mackay for supplies used on the flagpole project. Motion carried.

Dip in the Road report- Tom Mackay will resume his quest to have these areas properly finished. There are several places with a significant "dip in the road" long after development is finished. Councilor Gardner has been contacted about these problem areas. Call Tom if you would like to help with this project.

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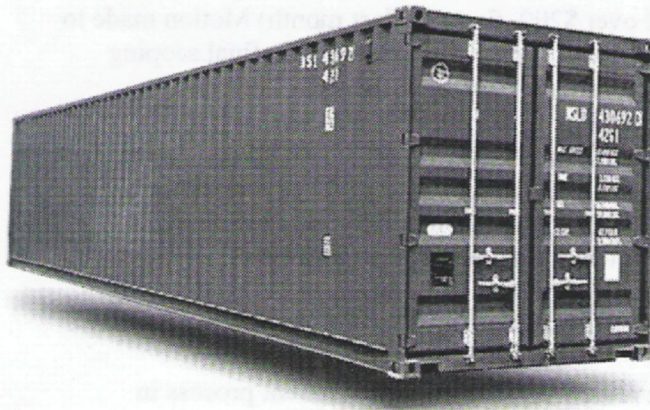
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Coming to a Forest Near You!

Hartley Nature Center's Urban Wilderness Camp

This will be the third summer in which Hartley is offering its Urban Wilderness Camp with sponsorship from whole Foods Co-op, Duluth superior Community Foundation and Minnesota's Lake superior coastal Program. When I contacted city officials about our water and sewer problems, they said they had not received many letters or e-mails about the problems, and therefore, were not as interested as they might have been if that were not the case. So, how about writing a letter? Here is some information you might use. Write from your perspective. Where are your concerns?

Talking or writing points: How about writing a letter?

We Park Pointers have 2 major water problems. Input and Output

Input: our water mains

- Are about 105 years old. (circa 1905)
- Do not recirculate as most mains do
- Unacceptably end in a septic leaching field surrounding the last hydrant at Sky Harbor Airport
- Provide increasingly poorer water clarity as distance from the bridge increases. (brown water)

Question: In what ways does the quality of our water mains affect you now? Do you have enough water pressure? Is your water clean and clear? How much more water can be provided if demand increases due to development or increased population on the Point? Who needs to know your concerns? What do you want: new water mains, increased zoning with water demands in mind? Other?

Output: Our existing sewer line from the bridge to the end of the Point

- Leaks
- Is about 50 years old
- Is the same old single pipe going over the bridge
- Is made of concrete which is leaky (and no longer used for sewers)
- Is a major source of e-coli bacteria from human, not bird, waste in the water.
- Would qualify for funding under Focus Area 3, Goal 3 of latest Great Lakes Restoration Initiative.

Question: Are you concerned about the adequacy of the sewer line? Are you concerned about the pollution of the bay and lake from leaks? Are you apprehensive about potential health issues related to e-coli? Are you interested in federal money under the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative to help us address our pollution problems?

What can you do? Write to ----- The more letters, the greater chance

Ask that studies be conducted. Ask EPA to apply part of that 475 million grant for Great Lakes Restoration, 2010.

Ask to be included in new federal funding \$\$\$\$\$\$
