Motions and Resolutions

By Mayor Snively:

Resolved, that it is necessary, and such necessity is hereby determined and declared to exist within the meaning of Section 73 of the city charter of the City of Duluth, that the right of way hereinafter described be taken by the city of Duluth, through condemnation proceedings, according to law, for the purpose of opening and constructing a boulevard and parkway which will extend the present boulevard in an easterly direction; the property affected by said condemnation, and through which the right of way is to be acquired, lying and being in the County of St. Louis and State of Minnesota, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

A triangular piece of land, lying and being in the Northwest corner of the Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$), and containing 0.116 acres;

a strip of land, 180 feet in width, across the Northwest quarter of the Southwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$), containing 6.160 acres;

a strip of land across the Southeast quarter of the Northwest quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$), containing 2.496 acres.

all in Section Six in Township Fifty (50) North, Range Thirteen (13) West;

A piece of land in the Southeast quarter of the Southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$), containing 7.35 acres;

a triangular piece of land in the southeast corner of the Southeast quarter of the Southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$), containing 0.31 acres.

all in Section Six (6), Township Fifty-one (51), Range Thirteen (13);

A 90-foot strip of land across Lots 2191, Block 154, and Lots 2192, 2193, 2194, 2195, 2196 and 2197, in Block 155.

all in Auditor's Plat of Crosley Park Addition to Duluth, according to the recorded plat thereof;

A 180-foot strip of land across the Southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$), containing 7.33 acres;

A strip of land of irregular width adjoining the northerly line of Auditor's Plat of Lester Park Garden Tracts, in the Northeast quarter of the Southwest quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$) containing 5.46 acres.

all in Section Thirty-two (32), in Township Fifty-one (51) North, Range Thirteen (13) West;

That part of the Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirty-two (32), in Township Fifty-one (51) North, Range Thirteen (13) West, lying northwesterly of Auditor's Plat of Lester Park Garden Tracts;

A strip of land 75 feet in width, across the northwesterly ends of lots 21, 45, 46, 47 and 48, of Auditor's Plat of Lester Park Garden Tracts, according to the recorded plat thereof;

All that part of the Southeast quarter of the Northwest quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$), of Section Thirty-two (32), in Township Fifty-one (51) North, Range Thirteen (13) West, lying southeasterly of the southeasterly line of the recorded plat of Amity Park, containing 4.56 acres.

Resolved, further, that the city attorney be, and he is hereby directed to take the necessary steps to secure the land and right of way above described, for the City of Duluth, for the uses and purposes hereinabove stated.
